GEORGE F. WALKER

was born August 23, 1947, in Toronto. His career as a playwright began in the early 70's when he submitted PRINCE OF NAPLES to Factory Theatre Lab after reading a flyer on a lamppost requesting scripts.

He became Factory Theatre Lab's resident playwright, 1972-1976, and was their Artistic Director for a short period. By 1980, he was the recipient of several Canada Council grants.

Among the plays for which he is noted are: BEYOND MOZAMBIQUE (1974), RAMONA AND THE WHITE SLAVES (1976), RUMORS OF OUR DEATH (1979), FILTHY RICH (1980), THEATRE OF THE FILM NOIR (1981) and SCIENCE AND MADNESS (1982).

He won the Dora Mavor Moore Award for best direction of a play produced in Toronto for his production of THEATRE OF THE FILM NOIR in 1981. In the same year, George F. Walker became the first Canadian-resident playwright to be produced by New York's Joseph Papp at the Public Theatre in New York, where he was also appointed writer-in-residence in order to work on the production of ZASTROZZI, the original New York production by New York Shakespeare Festival produced by Joseph Papp.

ZASTROZZI was first produced by Toronto Free Theatre, Toronto, Canada, 1977.

PAUL HANNA

is a freelance director, living in Fredericton, N.B. Mr. Hanna was the founding Director of Theatre New Brunswick's Young Company from 1974 to 1978 after which he became Assistant Managing Director of Theatre New Brunswick. From 1979, Mr. Hanna was an Administrator and eventually Workshop Director for the National Arts Centre English Theatre. His directing credits include such varied pieces as NARROW ROAD TO THE DEEP NORTH, GOD, DR. MILDEW'S MARVELOUS MAGICAL MUSICAL MEDICINE SHOW and an adaptation of THE ALCHEMIST for family audiences. This is Mr. Hanna's first production in Montreal.
