However, as those of us who see beyond the contrived hierarchy of a false reality crafted by power holders already understand, each household, neighborhood, affinity group, and individual is equipped with the potential to be their own master. This idea is constantly rejected by our "leaders" and within popular media as utopian and idealist, though arguably only because it makes us impossible to control. This is not just mindlessly utopian concept, but a recognition that people are better off organizing for themselves, and are more capable and knowledgeable to do so than some abstract body of rich legislators who will never know or understand us and our grievances. In rejecting coercive authority we can reestablish an old paradigm of participatory organizing and mutual aid found throughout many cultures in history, and indeed within many of the more enjoyable aspects of our own human relationships today.

In a Mutual Aid society, where wealth is consciously and consensually distributed to each according to need (attainable only through generations of self organizing), crime will be much more scarce than as it exists today in modern capitalism, when so few have so much, so many have nothing at all, and competition controls consciousness. In the mean time, in addition to structures designed to combat these disparities, there are community alternatives to violent police authority that could bring some much needed sanity to our culture, such as:

- Restorative Justice
- Conflict Mediation
- Community Watch Programs
- Community Spokescouncils
- Community Support Groups & Safe Centers
- Your Friends And Neighbors!!!

(this may seem obvious, but establishing close relationships with the people around you provides a great opportunity for conscious conflict resolution)
